7. Why were His brothers so offended and disappointed with Jesus? (451.1)

8. This world was not a place of ease and selfish gratification for Jesus, so what was it for him? (451.3)

9. Why were all the people looking for Jesus at this Feast? (451.4)

10. Why was everyone surprised and hushed when Jesus entered the court of the temple? (452.2)

11. Using a variety of representations why did Jesus warn these people of the calamity that would follow? (452.3)

12. The rabbis had neither taught Jesus, nor John the Baptist; so, who was their teacher? (453.1)

13. At the Feast what did Jesus declare Himself to be? (454.1)

14. As we come to Him, what does He promise to do? (452.2)

15. As Jesus spoke to the multitude, what did the Holy Spirit do? (454.2)
