9. How do these disciples finally recognize Jesus, and with what results? (800.4)

10. Though hungry and weary why do these disciples leave their meal untasted? (801.2)

11. Why do their hearts leap for joy and they seem to be living in a new world? (801.3)

12. What is the greatest message ever given to the world that is the foundation of hope for the whole human family? (801.3)
